



## **STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT**

At Illinois State University, students are expected to take responsibility for their academic careers. You, the student, are ultimately responsible for understanding and satisfying all degree requirements. In order to do this effectively, you should:

- Learn the name and location of your Academic Advisor early in the semester.
- Schedule an appointment EARLY for long-term planning services before the Advanced Registration period begins.
- Be prepared for advisement appointments – have a copy of your current schedule and an idea of what courses you plan to take.
- Attempt to clarify your interests, values and goals with your Academic Advisor so that you may be advised according to your appropriate major.
- Become familiar with your General Education, graduation and major requirements.
- Consult with your Academic Advisor concerning changes in your planned schedule.
- Consult with your Academic Advisor immediately when you are facing academic difficulty. Academic Advisors will help you to identify appropriate campus resources and can explain the consequences of poor grades.
- Accept responsibility for making your own decisions regarding your academic performance and schedule.
