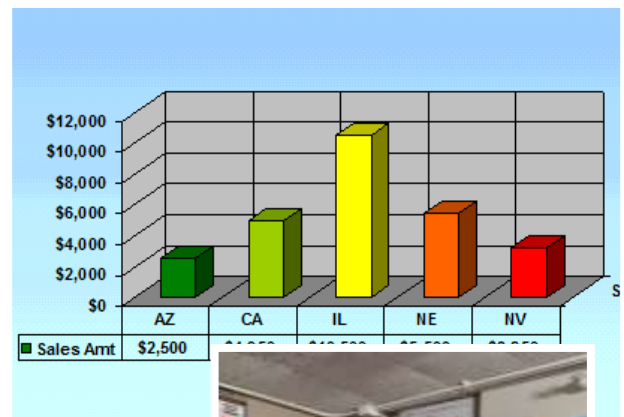
FIL 382.05 – Analysis of Insurance Companies
